There are countless examples of fantasy on the movie screen and television too, think of series like *Buffy the Vampire Slayer*, *Angel*, *Heroes*, *Xena: Warrior Princess*, *Pirates of the Caribbean*, *I am Legend*, *The Sixth Sense* and even *Sesame Street*.

Examples of sci-fi books are: 1984 (when this book first appeared in 1949, it was clearly set in the future), *The Hitchhiker's Guide to the Galaxy* and *The War of the Worlds* (this book was published in 1898!).

Sci-fi on television and in cinemas: *Stargate SG-1*, *Battlestar Galactica*, *Life on Mars*, *Star Wars* (this series has many fantasy features as well!), *Star Trek*, *ET*, *Alien*, *The Matrix*, *The Day after Tomorrow* and *Minority Report*.
